Luther Senior High School and Aoba-Japan International School Joint Program Program Information and Application Requirements

1. Program

This program is a hybrid curriculum between Luther Senior High School in Kumamoto and Aoba-Japan International School in Tokyo for students who will study mostly in English and go on to higher education. Students who complete the curriculum will receive the Global Leadership Diploma (GLD) offered by Aoba-Japan International School. This high school diploma allows students to apply for and attend universities around the world including North America, South America, Europe, Africa, and Asia, and Oceania (Australia, New Zealand, et al.) A Japanese high school diploma cannot be obtained through this hybrid curriculum.

*The GLD program requires two years of study and is Aoba-Japan International School's personalized high school pathway. It can be taken in-person or online and is accredited by the Council of International Schools (CIS) and the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC). The GLD covers Grades 11 and 12. If the students have not completed schooling up to grade 10 or cannot provide transcripts, they are first required to take a year of classes called the Transdisciplinary Learning Units (TDU). The classes of TDU are specifically designed to support students during the transition into Grades 11 and 12. These three years, spanning Grades, 10, 11 and 12, are equivalent to the three years of high school in Japan. For more details regarding the GLD, see the Aoba-Japan International School website.

Students will take approximately 30% of classes in-person, mostly in Japanese and 70% of classes online with Aoba-Japan International School. All lessons will be taken at the Luther Senior High School campus.

[In-person classes] approx. 10h (out of 32h)/week

Potential Subjects: Japanese for foreigners, PE, Music, Home Economics, Individualized English, etc. These subjects are taught in Japanese except for Individualized English which are taught by native English teachers. **Currently, no Japanese tutors or support is provided to facilitate for the Japanese classes.

[Online classes] approx. 22h (out of 32h)/week

Online classes for the GLD offered by Aoba-Japan International School will be taught in English separate from Japanese students. Individual support regarding classes is available from Aoba-Japan International School staff online. In the event that students have to leave Japan halfway through their degree requirements, they can continue to take classes even after returning to their home countries.

While participating in this hybrid program, students can benefit from both aspects; the campus life of Japanese high school students at Luther Senior High School and a curriculum taught in English with Aoba-Japan International School. By doing so, students can experience new culture in Japan, but also prepare for university in English with an international curriculum.

After-school extracurricular activities and clubs are also available for students in this program. The library, music practice rooms, and other such school facilities are available for students to use after school. Teachers, especially the American English teachers, are also available for students' questions. Students can join the following clubs:

[Athletic Clubs]

Basketball, Volleyball, Handball, Japanese Archery, Track and Field, Swimming, etc.

[Cultural Clubs]

Choir, Brass Band, Calligraphy, Tea Ceremony, Flower Arrangement, String Ensemble, etc.

2. Timing of Enrollment

The school year for this joint program begins in late August and ends in July. In the event that students cannot begin the school year in Japan, they could begin taking Aoba-Japan International School classes in their home country online, and then move to the Luther Senior High School campus later. (Conversely, as mentioned previously, in the event that students have to leave Japan halfway through their degree requirements, they can continue to take classes even after returning to their home countries.) Students are accepted at any time, but arrival in August is preferred.

3. Entrance Exam Procedure

The application for the joint program can be downloaded by following the link on the Luther Senior High School website. It can be completed online and submitted via the website. After the application is assessed/verified, the student will be notified on how to take the entrance exam.

Procedure after submission

Step one: Screening of application by Luther Senior High School and Aoba-Japan International School

Step two: Interview in English and exam in English (including English essay)

Interview in English: In order to test student's English proficiency, communication skills and assess motivation for learning.

Exam in English: In order to test basic academic skills in English with general questions across various subjects like math, science, etc.

After the application process has been completed, applicants will receive notification of the results. Accepted students will receive an acceptance letter from Luther Senior High School, along with an approval letter from Aoba-Japan International School within two months.
